
The three-story Stacie Mathewson Community Wellness Center, opening in late 2015, will encompass 37,000 square feet. It will have 42 exam rooms, a radiology lab, and a Primary Care Pediatric Clinic.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

In January, after demolishing the clinic and tearing up the asphalt, the construction crew dug out the old diesel tanks used to heat the old buildings. The crew then filled in an old drainage trench, flattened the dirt lot and laid down decomposed granite. Then the concrete began to flow.

Workers poured the footers for the building in February, creating the framework where the building's foundation will sit. As the crew quickly stitched together the rebar grids that would support the concrete, the base of the elevator shaft was put into place.

In March, workers dug out the base of the pillars that will support the building and filled them with cement. Soon after this, the building's foundation will be put into place, and the facility should start to make its vertical climb to completion.
