

Bereavement Leave

HOPES offers paid bereavement leave for staff to manage the material circumstances surrounding the loss of a loved one, including but not limited to the organization or attendance of a funeral, the completion of legal paperwork, and the management of an estate.

- 1. If an employee experiences a death in their **immediate family**, including pregnancy loss at any stage, the employee is eligible for paid bereavement leave as one week of pay for the hours normally worked in a week.
 - E.g. An employee working 40 hours a week will be granted 40 hours, and am employee working 24 hours a week will be granted 24 hours.
- 2. If a full-time employee experiences a death outside of their immediate family, the employee is eligible for one day of paid bereavement leave per year.
- 3. **Immediate family** is defined as: Parents or people who raised you, grandparents and grandchildren, your siblings, your significant other or spouse, your children, and people who reside in your household.
- 4. The failed adoption of an identified child may count as the loss of a child for the purpose of bereavement leave.
- 5. Pregnancy loss resulting in health conditions or disabilities may be protected by existing FMLA, Major Medical Leave, and Short Term Disability policies.
- 6. To qualify for bereavement leave, you must notify HR and track it in the payroll system.
